Dear Mr. Waldron:

We understand that Bradley International Airport (“BIA”), operated by the Connecticut Airport Authority, has prohibited photography from certain locations open to the public, including in the airport terminal and on Perimeter Road. Photographers have well established rights of free expression under the Connecticut and United States constitutions. Any photography ban must be narrowly tailored to address a significant state interest. Please provide us with copies of any policies and records of any practices that prohibit photography at BIA. Also, please provide us with the citation to statutes, ordinances, or regulations that support BIA’s practices and policies of prohibiting photography at the airport. Thank you for your time and attention. We look forward to your response by August 8<sup>th</sup>.
