The undersigned affiant, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

1. That I, Affiant #1, Trooper First Class Jackson #1422, being duly sworn, do depose that I am a regular member of the Connecticut Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Division of State Police and have been a member of the department since June 12, 2015. I am presently assigned as a Patrol Trooper, located at Troop G at 149 Prospect St, Bridgeport Connecticut. At all times mentioned herein I was acting as an official member of the Connecticut State Police. I have received training in criminal and motor vehicle collision investigations and attest that the following facts and circumstances are stated from personal knowledge and observation as well as information received from other Troopers and law enforcement officers acting in their official capacity and from official police reports. Affiant Jackson is the primary investigator of this affidavit and will be referred to as "Undersigned" or in the first person throughout this affidavit.

2. On or about Wednesday July 30th, 2025 the undersigned began conducting a criminal investigation into the actions of Katherine Hinds (D.O.B. [REDACTED]/1953) of [REDACTED] Hamden, CT after becoming aware of multiple Facebook posts that Hinds posted to her personal Facebook account that depict Hinds engaging in criminal activity. Hinds has been identified in at least six (6) separate incidents from the dates on or about 02/14/2025 through on or about 07/19/2025 where Hinds was located on a State of Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) owned overpass actively engaging in criminal activity related to unlawful protesting.

3. On or about Friday February 14th, 2025, the undersigned was conducting routine patrol in the undersigned's assigned and marked Connecticut State Police cruiser. At approximately 0849 hours, the undersigned observed a group of individuals gathered on the Cherry Hill Rd overpass in the City of Branford with a large sign affixed to the overpass. The Cherry Hill Rd overpass extends above and across Interstate 95 northbound and southbound between exit #53 and exit #54 northbound and

between exit #54 and exit #52 southbound and is north of the Branford Service Plazas. The large sign was affixed to the safety fencing of the overpass with the message "DEPORT MUSK" written across the sign. The sign was composed of eleven (11) individual black panels of which each panel had a white letter painted onto it. The panels were combined together to spell out "DEPORT MUSK" with a blank black panel separating "DEPORT and MUSK". The individual panels were physically attached to the safety fencing of the overpass with bungee cord type straps in order to make the message on the sign visible to the southbound side of interstate traffic during rush hour. The group assembled on the overpass was also waving at traffic as traffic passed by their location. The assembled group was creating a dangerous distraction to highway traffic and was in violation of Connecticut General Statute (C.G.S.) 13a-124 Unauthorized Signs Near a Highway and Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) regulations. As a result, the undersigned made contact with the group on the Cherry Hill Rd overpass. The undersigned identified Hinds by Hind's Connecticut Operator's License as being the organizer and/or leader of the group and their assembly. Hinds was advised that it is unlawful to physically attach and/or display any type of sign, in any way, to any property owned by the State of Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) including overpasses. Hinds was also advised that it is unlawful to create a distraction for vehicular interstate highway traffic that results in a public disturbance occurring on a Limited Access Highway (LAH) in the form of traffic congestion or otherwise. Hinds was given a lawful order to remove the signs that were affixed to the overpass safety fencing displayed for traffic to view and to leave the area. Hinds complied with this directive and was given a verbal warning for this incident and no further enforcement was taken.

4. On or about Thursday April 24th, 2025 the undersigned was conducting routine patrol in the undersigned's assigned and marked Connecticut State Police cruiser. At approximately 0829 hours, the undersigned observed a group of individuals once again gathered on the Cherry Hill Rd overpass in the City of Branford with a large sign affixed to the overpass. The large sign was affixed to the safety fencing of the overpass with the message "NO KINGS" written across the sign. This sign was constructed in similar fashion to the aforementioned signs that were observed on 02/14/2025. Each individual black panel contained a white painted letter and the panels were combined together to spell out the message "NO KINGS". Each panel utilized bungee cords straps to physically attach the panels to the safety fencing. Due to the assembly creating a dangerous distraction to highway traffic and being in violation of Connecticut General Statute (C.G.S.) 13a-124 Unauthorized Sign Near a Highway and Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) regulations, the undersigned made contact with the group that was on the Cherry Hill Rd overpass. Upon arrival, the undersigned identified that Hinds was once again present and appeared to the organizer of the assembly. Hinds verbally stated that Hinds along with Hinds' group, were very angry with the United States (U.S) Government. Hinds was again advised that it is unlawful to physically attach and/or display any type of sign, in any way, to any property owned by the State of Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) including overpasses. Hinds was again advised that it is unlawful to create a distraction for vehicular interstate

highway traffic that results in a public disturbance occurring on a Limited Access Highway (LAH) in the form of traffic congestion or otherwise. Hinds was given a lawful order to remove the signs that were affixed to the overpass safety fencing and to leave the area. Hinds complied with this directive and was given a second verbal warning for this incident and informed that she was being criminally trespassed from occupying any and all State of Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) owned overpasses for any purpose other than traveling across the overpass as it intended to be used for. Hinds was advised that the next offense could result in her being placed under arrest for criminal trespass and additional charges.

5. On or about Monday May 19th, 2025, the undersigned was conducting routine patrol in the undersigned's assigned and marked Connecticut State Police cruiser. At approximately 0834 hours, the undersigned observed a group of individuals gathered on the Howard Ave overpass in the City of New Haven with multiple large signs affixed to both sides of the overpass. The Howard Ave overpass extends above and across Interstate 95 northbound and southbound between exit #44 and exit #46 northbound and between exit #46 and exit #44 southbound. The large signs were affixed to the safety fencing of the overpass with the message "Free Khalil" and other various anti-Trump, anti-ICE and anti-Government political messaging written across the signs. These signs were constructed in similar fashion to the aforementioned signs that were observed on 02/14/2025 and 04/24/2025. Each individual black panel contained a white painted letter and the panels were combined together to spell out the messages. Each panel utilized bungee cords straps to physically attach the panels to the safety fencing. This incident was brought to the undersigned's attention due to unusually heavy traffic congestion that was occurring on both directions of the highway in that area. Traffic was backing up in both directions for approximately one half (1/2) of a mile prior to the overpass. Due to the assembly creating a dangerous distraction to highway traffic and being in violation of Connecticut General Statute (C.G.S) 13a-124 Unauthorized Sign Near a Highway and Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) regulations, the undersigned made contact with the group that was on the Howard Ave overpass. Upon arrival, the undersigned immediately identified Hinds as being the organizer and leader of the assembly. Hinds was immediately ordered to remove the signs that were affixed to the overpass as they were creating heavy traffic congestion in the area and a hazardous situation for the motoring public, as well as emergency vehicles that may need to pass through the area. Hinds and other members of the assembly refused all lawful orders to remove the signs. Hinds and other members of the assembly were then given lawful commands to produce a form of identification and/or their names and dates of birth of which all refused to do so. Only one member of the group ultimately produced their identification after numerous lawful commands. The group only began to remove the signs after additional lawful commands were given and after the undersigned began removing the signs for them. The assembly did ultimately end up removing all of the signs and agreed to clear the area. Due to this assembly being larger than previous ones and other pending calls for service, Hinds was given a third and final verbal warning for this incident and advised that the next

offense would result in Hinds arrest. The remainder of the group was advised that it is unlawful to not present their identifications to law enforcement upon request during a criminal investigation, but due to other pending calls for service that required Troopers to clear the scene, they would not be charged at this time.

6. On Friday, July 19, 2025, the Connecticut State Police Troop G received multiple 911 calls reporting "protesters" standing on the Stevens Ave overpass above I-95 northbound in the City of West Haven. Callers reported that the individual was waving at passing traffic and displaying a banner over the overpass railing. Trooper Morales #1369 and Trooper Farrow #1214 responded to the scene and observed numerous individuals present on the Stevens Ave overpass actively displaying a large banner and waving to passing motorists traveling northbound and southbound on Interstate 95. The activity was causing a significant distraction to passing motorists, resulting in vehicles slowing down and frequent honking. The conduct was deemed to constitute a hazard to the motorists on Interstate 95 as the group in question was intentionally trying to gain the attention of the motorists on the highway. While Trooper Morales and Trooper Farrow were speaking with Hinds, they observed that traffic volume had significantly increased, which was unusual for that time on a Saturday. Traffic in both the northbound and southbound lanes of Interstate 95 became bumper to bumper. Trooper Morales reported that based on his investigation, interaction with Hinds, and observations, he determined that Hinds organized a small group assembly to intentionally get the attention of motorists on Interstate 95 and that Hinds was previously advised that she could not be in that location and that Hinds returned anyway without permission. Trooper Morales also determined that Hinds was displaying a banner on State Property without the required permits. As a result, Trooper Morales placed Hinds under arrest and charged her with C.G.S. 53a-181; Breach of the Peace in the Second Degree, C.G.S. 53a-108; Criminal Trespass in the Second Degree and C.G.S. 13a-124; Unauthorized Signs on a Highway.

7. It should be noted that the Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) requires permits for any activity involving banners, signage, or displays on state highways or bridge structures. None of the individuals at any of the aforementioned incidents were able to produce such permit. Unauthorized displays not only violates CTDOT regulations but also poses legitimate public safety risks, including but not limited to driver distraction, which may lead to traffic congestion or motor vehicle collisions. The safety fencing is also not engineered to have signs attached to it.

8. It should also be noted that each one of these incidents appears to occur during the hours of 0800 and 0900, displays similar types of signs with political messaging and have Hinds present at each one.

9. The undersigned conducted further investigation after becoming aware of the 07/19/2025 arrest of Hinds, which led to the discovery of multiple Facebook posts made by Hinds on Hinds' personal Facebook account. These posts depicted Hinds engaged in similar criminal activity on two separate

overpasses and are dated after Hinds was warned three times about such activity. The profile picture on the Facebook account depicts Katherine Hinds (██████████ 1953). The female in the profile picture is the same female that the undersigned interacted with during the aforementioned incidents and is the same female that appears on Connecticut Operator's License # ██████████ in the Connecticut Department of Motor Vehicles (CTDMV) files which is assigned to Katherine Hinds (D.O.B ██████████ 1953). In addition, the female featured in this account's profile picture is also the same female that is in the 07/19/2025 arrest photo of Katherine Hinds (D.O.B ██████████ 1953). This Facebook account features numerous posts where Katherine Hinds posts descriptions, pictures and videos of herself participating in numerous protests on overpasses and other venues all around the northeast. The vast majority of these posts are date stamped and describe where and when they occurred in the post's caption. The content and context of each post is similar and consistent and clearly depicts that this account is owned and operated by Katherine Hinds (D.O.B ██████████ /1953) of ██████████ Hamden, CT (CT OP # ██████████).

10. On or about Saturday July 5th, 2025, Hinds made a Facebook post on Hinds' Facebook account that included the caption "#VisibilityBrigade -- taking a stand on the 4th in Branford, CT. Beautiful day to oppose tyranny followed by two (2) photos. The pictures which appear to be taken from an unlawful position on the highway, in violation of Connecticut General Statute (C.G.S) 53-182 Reckless Use of a Highway by a Pedestrian, show two separate banners affixed to the safety fencing of the overpass. The first banner is a black banner with yellow writing that reads "No Kings, Been there, Done that. The second banner is a black banner with yellow writing that reads "Love Liberty? Oppose Tyranny!" There is also an upside down American flag in front of the second banner. The banners appear to be affixed to the safety fencing of the over pass in a similar fashion as past incidents. Each banner is surrounded by other individuals who are part of the assembly. Based upon knowledge and experience collected by working routine patrol, the undersigned has identified this overpass as the Featherbed Lane overpass located north of exit #55 in the City of Branford. Based upon Hinds own caption on this post and the date the post was created, this incident took place on July 4th, 2025 which is after Hinds was warned three (3) separate times against performing this unlawful activity. It should be noted that the "#VisibilityBrigade is a group that Hinds appears to be a member of who conducts similar unlawful activity across the northeast. This assembly posted by Hinds is identical to previous assemblies and appears to have been organized and executed by Hinds unlawfully.

11. On or about Saturday July 12th, 2025, Hinds made a Facebook post on Hinds' Facebook account that included the caption "Over I-95 in CT this morning. Sign on the left: RESISTANCE IS NOT FUTILE; on the right: DUE PROCESS IS THE LAW. We felt a little anxious before putting signs up -- but a lot better when we noted the constant positive response from drivers. #VisibilityBrigade. PS: Bridge protest #43 for us. Since 1/20/25. The pictures show two separate black banners displayed against the safety fencing facing both the northbound and southbound directions of Interstate 95. The

banners are accompanied by an assembly of approximately 13 individuals who appear to be waving at passing traffic on Interstate 95 traveling on both the northbound and southbound directions. The photographs are taken from the top side of the overpass and it is unclear what messages are on the banners. Based upon knowledge and experience collected by working routine patrol, the undersigned has identified this overpass as the Featherbed Lane overpass located north of exit #55 in the City of Branford. Based upon the date the post was created and the caption reading "We felt a little anxious before putting signs up - - but a lot better when we noted the constant positive response from drivers." it appears that Hinds was well aware that Hinds was not authorized to display the banners on the overpass with the assembly of people Hinds appears to have organized. The caption highlights that Hinds knowingly and intentionally violated the lawful directive Hinds was given on three separate prior occasions. This lawful directive directed Hinds it was unlawful to display signs from a State of Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) overpass and organize an assembly of individuals on an overpass for the purpose of generating awareness for Hinds' cause from the motoring public.

12. It should be noted that on or about Friday April 25th, 2025, Hinds made a post that reads "Another week on the bridges. Upwards of 1,000 votes of support from drivers. Two police encounters (friendly and not-so), one cranky state trooper. These are not normal times. Honk if you see the #Visibility Brigade next week - - on a bridge near you throughout CT." This caption is followed by a picture of the Stevens Ave overpass in the City of West Haven with two banners displayed on the safety fencing. One reads "Due Process is the Law" and the other reads "RESIST". The photo appears to be taken from an unlawful position on the highway, in violation of Connecticut General Statute (C.G.S) 53-182 Reckless Use of a Highway by a Pedestrian, This post collaborates by Hind's own admission, that Hinds knowingly and intentionally continued to engage in criminal activity after being involved in multiple Police investigations for engaging in similar criminal activity. This post highlights Hinds acknowledgement of Hinds interaction with the Connecticut State Police while Hinds continues to project Hinds intention on returning to "a bridge near you throughout CT" after Hinds was criminally trespassed from State of Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) overpasses. The post also details that Hinds routinely visits overpasses throughout the State of Connecticut and that Hinds has no intention of stopping Hinds engagement in criminal activity despite being receiving multiple discretionary warnings.

13. Based on the aforementioned information gleaned from the investigation, it is believed that Katherine Hinds was unlawfully present on the Featherbed Lane overpass in the City of Branford on or about Friday July 4th, 2025 and on or about Saturday July 12th, 2025 and participated in the erection of unauthorized signs onto the Featherbed Lane overpass after Hinds was criminally trespassed on at least two (2) separate occasions.

14. That based upon the investigation efforts of the Affiant, which are based upon the Affiant's own personal
